## From The Staff:

The National Service Committee for the Catholic Charismatic Renewal has recently developed a new Vision and Mission Statement. We looked at this statement at last month's leader training workshops. We have included a copy of this statement in this newsletter.

The Vision Statement first focuses on the fact that we can "experience" the Holy Spirit in our lives, making the whole Trinity come alive for us. Being baptized in the Spirit is a recognizable experience of the Spirit where God's presence becomes more real in our lives. The Holy Spirit opens us to a "life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ." We realize that Jesus Christ is worth being first in our lives. Our life takes on a new direction in seeking to follow Jesus. The Spirit also opens us to the "Love of God the Father." We sense God's personal love for us and the Spirit witnesses to our spirit that we are children of God and heirs with Christ.

Secondly, the statement mentions that the Spirit "empowers" us. Jesus called the Spirit "power from on high." This empowerment has three major areas:

1. Personal Holiness: Loving like Jesus with his qualities; overcoming sin; growing in the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, self-control, etc.);
2. Renewed Catholic Life: Sacraments, Mass, Scripture come alive; our families are more influenced by our faith; prayer and faith sharing groups develop; our faith influences are work and all of society.
3. Evangelization: We have a greater desire to share our faith; receive gifts of the Spirit to share our faith; and are empowered to pray with people for signs and wonders that confirm the faith.

The Mission Statement describes 5 areas that the Spirit is calling us to focus on:

1. The grace and culture of Pentecost: The Spirit is a touch of grace that we experience, but also affects our whole lifestyle and culture.
2. The full role of the Holy Spirit: We are to be conscious ourselves and help the whole Church to be aware of the 4 major roles of the Spirit (Union with God, Inner Transformation, Ministry Empowered by Charisms, Building Community). Our prayer groups need to be growing in each of these 4 areas.
3. Leadership Development: We need to keep growing as leaders and develop new leaders for our groups.
4. Catholic Organizations and Movements and Authentic Ecumenism: In our diocese we are cooperating with other Catholic Movements like Cursillo, A.C.T.S., etc. and are seeking Christian Unity (ecumenism).
5. Youth and Young Adults: We support CCCR's Youth Ministry and seek to reach out to youth.

Let us reflect on these areas individually and in our groups, and ask the Holy Spirit how he is calling each of our groups to move forward under his guidance.

### COMMENTS ON RECENT LEADERSHIP WORKSHOPS

We thank Fr. Bob Hogan for the two outstanding leadership workshops held on April 25 and May 2 at the CCCR. A letter of invitation was sent to all the English prayer group leaders asking them and their core groups to attend (if you did not get a letter, call us to make sure you are on the list).

Multiple page handouts were given to all who attended, so if you did not attend and would like a copy, please drop by the CCCR and get them. We expect to have a similar workshop for the Spanish groups in the fall.

One of the key issues was the breakdown of groups into zones, that is 4 or 5 prayer groups in a designated area, i.e. northwest. The information was very well received and the "zone groups" met to review what could or should be done in their areas. A possibility is that a particular zone would host a Day of Renewal for the city. Another one is that speakers from within the zone would do teachings to the other groups in the area.

A lot of work was put into having these workshops and I thank Fr. Bob, the service committee and all who helped. To all the attendees and their enthusiasm, without you we would not have a vibrant charismatic renewal in the Archdiocese. Keep up the good work.

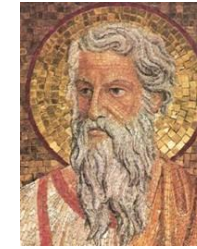

## Year of Saint Paul

### St. Paul and the Coming of the Lord

Advent means coming.

Today we connect the word *Advent* with the word *Christmas*.

We read of the birth of Jesus in the letter of Paul to the Galatians 4:5.

It is put as simply as this:

*When the fullness of time had come,  
God sent his Son,  
born of a woman,  
born under the law,  
to ransom those under the law,  
so that we might receive adoption.*

Raymond Brown in his book, *The Birth of the Messiah*, writes that the phrase "born of a woman" stresses "what Jesus shared with those whom he redeemed, precisely because it is applicable to everyone who walks this earth" (p. 519). He says that this is designed to underline the historicity of Jesus.

There is no mention of the birth of Christ in the Gospels of Mark or John. Raymond Brown writes that "In the early Christian preaching the birth of Jesus had not yet been seen in the same salvific light as the death and resurrection" (p. 28).

Paul does however make reference to the coming of the Lord as he writes of the second coming. In fact, though we celebrate the coming of Jesus as a baby we also look forward to the Second Coming. In the Apostles' Creed we say, "He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary." We profess that in a similar way in the Nicene Creed. We also say that "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead." This is also similar phrasing in both creeds. At Mass we often proclaim the acclamation: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again."

On December 14, the Third Sunday of Advent, we will read from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24, which exhorts us to rejoice always, pray without ceasing, not to quench the Spirit, not to despise prophetic utterances, but to test everything, retain what is good, and refrain from evil. Paul asks the God of peace to make us perfectly holy and that we may be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Earlier in the same chapter Paul tells us that we are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of night or of darkness. The difference for us is day and night. We are of the day. This is not the natural dawn that follows night but it is the "day of the Lord." Fr. George Montague, in *The Living Thought of St. Paul*, stresses that we must be alert [as we so often hear during Advent] not because we do not know the day or the hour but because we are children of the day. In other words, we need to live like the children that we are - children of the day, children of our heavenly Father.

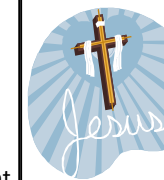
During this December and this Advent, let us celebrate that Jesus became one of us so that we might be adopted children, made for day, "with the coming of Christ on the horizon of our thoughts", (p. 24).
